ASPIRE CHAMBER CHOIR Sunday, November 11, 2018 at 3:00 P.M.

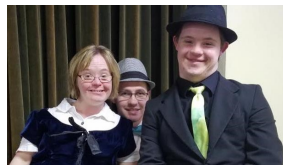
